3 Year Program

1st Year (Class IX): US English I & US History

2nd Year (Class X): US English II & US Government/Economics

3rd Year (Class XI): US English III & SAT/ACT Test Prep



How do students complete their work?

Students work on selected materials from home on their computers.

The program provides all necessary platforms, systems, and tools that students need readily available to them to accomplish the following:

- For communication between students and teachers, between teachers and parents (parents have their own specific accounts), and between teachers and the Program Director.
- For content and activities in which students review, work on and complete their assignments.



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How do students and teachers communicate?

- •Teachers are available during their scheduled office hours.
- •Scheduled appointments must be requested by the students in advance and arranged between the student and the teacher.
- •Students participate in Mandatory and Content Based Live Sessions. These are required group sessions and are essential in reinforcing the acquired knowledge, clarification of any materials covered in the students' courses, and utilizing and practicing the English language.

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How much will each student work?

The program requires a medium level of effort similar to that of an extracurricular activity: 3 - 5 hours each week. This is dependent upon the student's ability and the number of subjects being taken.

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How are students monitored?

- Parents can contact their children's teachers at any point during the course as long as they submit a request in advance.
- We track student progress through regular contact between the program director at the home school and the teacher in the United States.
- We continuously evaluate students by observing their progress in achieving the objectives proposed in each module.



How is a student's progress tracked?

- If a student falls behind in their coursework, the teacher in the United States will contact the student, parent and program director at the home school.
- Students regularly recieve progress reports throughout each semester. If progress is not satisfactory, teachers and/or academic coaches Will provide suggestions on how students can improve their perfomance.
- Students are required to take written tests and participate in live sessions both individually and as a group to monitor their progress.



Qualifications

• To receive a High School Diploma from the United States, the student's school in their country of origin must provide Academica International Studies with an official transcript of their grades.

2.0 Grade Point Average (GPA) and a minimum average of 70% in all subjects.



A student's GPA is calculated by adding up the final numerical grades received on all subjects taken up to date, and is then divided between the number of subjects taken to find the overall average.
